Cocktails

Cosmopolitan £9

Did it originate in trendy San Francisco bars in the 1970s, or during the 30s as others claim? Whenever it was born, one thing is certain, the refreshing mix of cranberry and fresh lime shaken with vodka and Cointreau is one to try again and again

Tom Collins £9

First thought to have been served in 1876 in a London hotel, this cocktail soon became popular worldwide. Called 'decadent homemade lemonade', the blend of fresh lemon and a large Plymouth gin makes it the perfect accompaniment to a hot summer's day

Margarita £12

Early stories date this cocktail to the 1930s in Mexico. Today it's the most popular tequila-based cocktail in the world. With the combination of a large tequila, Cointreau, fresh lime and a salt rimmed glass, it's not for the faint-hearted

Espresso Martini £9

Claimed to originate in the early 1980s in Soho London, this is a real pick-me-up with Tia Maria, espresso, sugar syrup and a kick of vodka

Mojito £9

A traditional mojito contains five ingredients: white rum, sugar, fresh lime juice, sparkling water and mint. The combination of sweet, citrus and mint was developed to complement the kick of rum and today it's one of the world's most recognised cocktails

Singapore Fizz £10

Our take on the traditional Singapore Sling, this combines gin and cherry brandy, which is then finished with extra bubbles from the finest prosecco

Parisian Royale £9

An interesting take on the more traditional Kir Royale, this prosecco cocktail combines bubbles with black raspberry liqueur which takes this timeless classic to another dimension

Old Fashioned £9

The old fashioned was first documented in 1806. Since then there have been many variations of the recipe. It is more commonly recognised as a potent concoction of rye whiskey, sugars and bitters. In 2015 it was named as Louisville, Kentucky's official cocktail

Champagne Classic £14

Combining brandy, champagne, sugars and bitters. The Champagne Classic first appeared in 1862, and has since featured in film greats including Casablanca and The Big Sleep

Maverick Martini £14

An ultimate modern classic born in 2002, using vodka, passionfruit and champagne. The Maverick Martini was named after a club in Cape Town, and is now more commonly known as the 'Porn Star Martini'

Le Fizz £14

The original fizz cocktail featured in the 1887 edition of the Bartender's Guide. It has since evolved with many variations to the recipe. Our recipe uses vodka instead of gin

Piña Colada £10

The Piña Colada has been the national drink of Puerto Rico since 1978. Earliest known stories of the Piña date back to the 19th century, where a Puerto Rican pirate would boost his crew's morale by giving them rum, coconut and pineapple

SAUNTON SANDS COLLECTION

White Lady £12

Made popular in the 1930s after being published in the famous Savoy cocktail book. A source also claims that the White Lady was Laurel & Hardy's favourite drink. Our recipe combines Plymouth gin and Cointreau, with the strength to transport you back to the prohibition era

Mai Tai £15

Originally created in 1933, there are still two bars claiming they created it first. Recognised as being heavy on rum, this classic is also well known for featuring in the Elvis Presley classic, Blue Hawaii

Side Car £11

Created with a mix of cognac and orange liqueur, the side car is often singled out as 'the only good cocktail to come out of the nightmare that was prohibition'. There are many variations to this cocktail, we are using the French version made popular in the 1930s

Vermouth Cassis £9

Created in Paris in 1934, this cocktail went on to feature on the Esquire list. It was originally called 'pompier' which translates as 'fireman'. Mixing vermouth and black raspberry liqueur, the finished result is a dry classic cocktail

Daiquiri £9

Invented during the Spanish-American war, this cocktail was named after Daiquiri beach in Santiago, Cuba. Traditionally made in a shaker with rum, fresh lime and sugar, there are many adaptations – we are using the simple recipe with fresh lime made popular in the 1930s

MARTINI

One of the most recognised and classic cocktails of all time, the origin of the martini is unclear, but there are stories dating it back to the 1860s. Throughout the years it has remained popular, with many bartenders adding it to their repertoire. There are many variations including shaken, stirred or the dirty martini, and it offers something for most drinkers. A very dry cocktail, traditionally made with gin or vodka, vermouth is then added as per the drinker's individual taste, and the finished result is a smooth, chilled cocktail with a touch of class

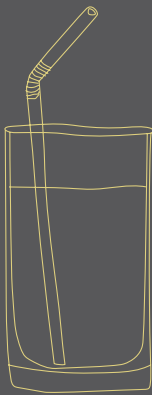

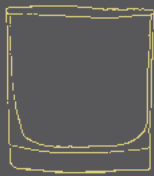

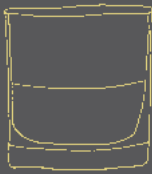

MALT WHISKY

Glenfiddich 12 year Malt £5

A smooth and beautifully balanced Speyside malt with notes of pear and subtle oak.

Glemorangie 10 Year Malt £5

Bowmore 12 Year Malt £5.60

This distillery, founded in 1830, is the only one situated on the Isle of Skye. Water used during the distilling process runs from springs surrounding the distillery, contributing to the peatiness of the malt

Dalwhinnie 15 Year Malt £5.60

Being the highest distillery in Scotland, Dalwhinnie takes advantage of the clean spring waters. The smoky, floral aroma is a perfect balance for beginners in the malt experience

Oban 14 Year Malt £5.60

Produced in one of the smallest distilleries in Scotland, Oban boasts a West Highland flavour, combining sweet and smoky notes on the palate

Ardbeg 10 Year Malt £5.60

Voted Whisky of the Year in 2008, some call it a must-have for fans of single malt. Boasting a combination of flavours of lemon, lime, vanilla and smokiness, this is a masterpiece

Laphroaig 10 Year Malt £5.60

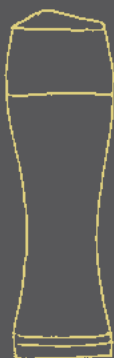
A full-bodied malt distilled in the same way today as 75 years ago. The smoky flavour is made from peat only found on Islay, giving Laphroaig its unique rich flavour

Lagavulin 16 Year Malt £5.60
